Eola is THE largest lodge in the district with over 400 members, yet during role call at the Lodge meeting with the new Grand Master, EOLA had only 3 Officers present, and 2 other brothers present 1 one of which is an Honorary member. That stood when called, (we also had 2 members in the kitchen) THIS WAS A TOTAL OF 5 MEMBERS OUT OF 400+ MEMBERS. Brothers I have only one question, WHY?

When we have our monthly meeting we have for the most part an average of 16-22 members attending, and its usually the same members. WHY?

I hear the excuse well it's a long drive to get to Lodge!

I work early the next day!

I worked late and it takes too long to drive home and then to Lodge!

I forgot!

I don't want this to be taken the wrong way however I drive 45 minutes each way after working 10-11 hour day and then I change clothes at the Lodge. I also know that there are several other Brothers who venture 30 + minute drive to attend meetings.

Brothers you get out of Masonry what you put in. If you are not going to support and be a part of the Lodge why did you join. If you want to become a part of the Leadership Line you have an obligation to be there and be a part of the Lodge. The Lodge depends and needs you.
